

Gender Pronouns

The following chart is a reference guide to traditional and gender neutral pronouns.

Many others exist, but this chart should help you conjugate and use any type of pronoun.

{Name}	{Name}	{Name's}	{Name's}	{Name}	Varies by name	{Name} is a writer and wrote that book. Those ideas are {Name's}. I like {Name} and {Name's} ideas.
They	Them	Their	Theirs	Themself	Pronounced as it looks	They are a writer and wrote that book <i>themself</i> . Those ideas are <i>theirs</i> . I like <i>them</i> and <i>their</i> ideas.
She	Her	Her	Hers	Herself	Pronounced as it looks	She is a writer and wrote that book herself. Those ideas are hers. I like her and her ideas.
He	Him	His	His	Himself	Pronounced as it looks	He is a writer and wrote that book himself. Those ideas are his. I like him and his ideas.
Ze	Hir	Hir	Hirs	Hirself	Zee, Here, Here, Heres, Hereself	Ze is a writer and wrote that book hirself. Those ideas are hirs. I like hir and hir ideas.
Ze	Zim	Zir	Zirs	Zirself	Zee, Zim, Zere, Zeres, Zereself	Ze is a writer and wrote that book zirself. Those ideas are zirs. I like zim and zir ideas.
Per	Per	Per	Pers	Perself	Pronounced as it looks	Per is a writer and wrote that book perself. Those ideas are pers. I like per and per ideas.
Ey	Em	Eir	Eirs	Eirself	A, M, Ear, Ears, Earself	Ey is a writer and wrote that book eirself. Those ideas are eirs. I like em and eir ideas.
Xe	Xem	Xyr	Xyrs	Xemself	Zee, Zim, Zere, Zeres, Zereself	Xe is a writer and wrote that book Xemself. Those ideas are xyrs. I like xem and xyr ideas.
