Ecclesiastes 3:1-13 • For everything there is a season.

For everything there is a season, and a time for every matter under heaven: a time to be born, a time to die; a time to plant, and a time to pluck up what is planted; a time to kill, and a time to heal; a time to break down, and a time to build up; a time to weep, and a time to laugh; a time to mourn, and a time to dance; a time to throw away stones, and a time to gather stones together; a time to embrace, and a time to refrain from embracing; a time to seek, and a time to lose; a time to keep, and a time to throw away; a time to tear, and a time to sew; a time to keep silence, and a time to speak; a time to love, and a time to hate; a time for war, and a time for peace. Then they all will answer, "Lord, when was it that we saw you hungry or thirsty or a stranger or naked or sick or in prison, and did not take care of you?" Then he will answer them, "Truly I tell you, just as you did not do it to one of the least of these, you did not do it to me." And these will go away into eternal punishment, but the righteous into eternal life."

# Next Sunday Sunday, Jan 8, 2022 Epiphany & Baptism of Jesus Life Passages

**Children & Youth:** Children begin in the sanctuary, then go to Kids' Church. Youth meet in the youth room at the beginning of the service.

Acts 10:34-43 • Gentiles hear the Good News.

Matthew 3:13-17 • Jesus and John the Baptizer.

Sermon: A Change of Course

In the reading from the book of Acts (officially "The Acts of the Apostles"), after a persuasive vision from God, Peter, somewhat surprisingly, speaks in front of an unexpected audience: Romans, who, as Gentiles—those outside the original covenant between God and the people of God. We hear Peter share with them God's "statement of inclusion," that is, the message of Jesus. In the Gospel passage, we witness Jesus at the very beginning of his public ministry. John at first respectfully declines when Jesus asks to be baptized, too, but Jesus convinces John that it is the right thing to do. Immediately afterwards, God adds a very personal blessing. When have you had to be convinced to re-think deeply held ideas or convictions? What happened as a result?
