Six days later, Jesus took with him Peter and James and his brother John and led them up a high mountain, by themselves. And he was transfigured before them, and his face shone like the sun, and his clothes became dazzling white. Suddenly there appeared to them Moses and Elijah, talking with Jesus. Then Peter said to Jesus, "Lord, it is good for us to be here; if you wish, I will make three dwellings here, one for you, one for Moses, and one for Elijah." ## **Communion Sunday & Minute for Mission**

**Children & Youth:** Children begin in the sanctuary, then go to Kids' Church. Youth meet in the youth room at the beginning of the service.

**Psalm 32** • Blessed are those whose sins are forgiven.

Genesis 2:15-17; 3:1-7 • The tree of knowledge of good and evil.

Matthew 4:1-11 • Jesus tempted in the desert.

Sermon: Discerning choice.

The story of Jesus being tempted in the desert is one that inspires us, and challenges us. Can we be as strong as Jesus when faced with a choice that either trusts in God or leads to satisfying our human desires? The wilderness and the garden of Eden are places of struggle. Temptation, as defined by the Merriam-Webster dictionary, is "to entice or to do wrong by promise of pleasure or gain." Adam and Eve were enticed by the serpent, and Jesus was enticed by the devil. How does the practice of wisdom, and the practice of discernment help us make choices that lead us to God rather than away? How will we seek to resist evil and live in love and justice?

After buying boxed items at a retail outlet, leave the packaging behind so that the retailers take some responsibility for package reduction.
