

# God's Holy Word

Prayer of Illumination:

Living Word, your revelations are inspiring, unsettling, and sometimes beyond our comprehension. We give thanks for your word, which continues to be an everlasting source of wisdom.<sup>3</sup>

Scripture: Arleen Drysdale

Acts 10: 34-42 • Simon Peter at the centurion's home.

Then Peter began to speak to them: "I truly understand that God shows no partiality, but in every nation anyone who fears God does what is right is acceptable to God. You know the message God sent to the people of Israel, preaching peace by Jesus Christ - who is Lord of all. That message spread throughout Judea, beginning in Galilee after the baptism that John announced: how God anointed Jesus of Nazareth with the Holy Spirit and with power; how he went about doing good and healing all who were oppressed by the devil, for God was with Jesus. We are witnesses to all that Jesus did both in Judea and in Jerusalem. They put him to death by hanging him on a tree; but God raised him on the third day and allowed him to appear, not to all the people but to us who were chosen by God as witnesses, and who ate and drank with him after he rose from the dead. Jesus commanded us to preach to the people and to testify that he is the one ordained by God as judge of the living and the dead."
