

1 Peter 2:19-25 • Our example in suffering

It is a credit to you if, being aware of God, you endure pain while suffering unjustly. If you endure when you are beaten for doing wrong, what credit is that? But if you endure when you do right and suffer for it, you have God's approval. For to this you have been called, because Christ also suffered for you, leaving you an example, so that you should follow in his footsteps. Christ committed no sin, and no deceit was found in his mouth." When he was abused, he did not return abuse; when he suffered, he did not threaten; but he entrusted himself to the one who judges justly. He himself bore our sins in his body on the cross, so that, free from sins, we might live for righteousness; by his wounds you have been healed. For you were going astray like sheep, but now you have returned to the shepherd and guardian of your souls.

John 10:1-10 • Jesus as shepherd and gate.

Very truly, I tell you, anyone who does not enter the sheepfold by the gate but climbs in by another way is a thief and a bandit. The one who enters by the gate is the shepherd of the sheep. The gatekeeper opens the gate for the shepherd, and the sheep hear the shepherd's voice. The shepherd calls the sheep by name and leads them out. When the shepherd has brought out all the sheep that belong to the flock, the shepherd goes ahead of them, and the sheep follow because they know the shepherd's voice. They will not follow a stranger, but they will run away because they do not know the voice of strangers." Jesus used this figure of speech with them, but they did not understand what he was saying to them. So again Jesus said to them, "Very truly, I tell you, I am the gate for the sheep. All who came before me are thieves and bandits; but the sheep did not listen to them. I am the gate. Whoever enters by me will be saved, and will come in and go out and find pasture. The thief comes only to steal and kill and destroy. I came that they may have life, and have it abundantly."

May we hear what the Spirit is saying to the church.

# Worship Notes

Director of Music, Dr. Allan Bevan is in Toronto this weekend attending the premiere of his large-scale composition "*Perfectly Mad*..." Thanks to Belinda Chiang and Raydene Koch for their assistance with the music in our worship service today!

The verse that precedes today's epistle reading from 1 Peter reads, "Slaves, accept the authority of your masters with all deference, not only those who are kind and gentle but also those who are harsh." In one way, it's understandable that the lectionary omits this verse for any number of reasons, not the least of which is so that anyone who is to preach doesn't have to confront a passage that seems to condone not only slavery, but harsh slave masters! A very brief bit of context is that letters written by Christian leaders only a generation or so after Jesus' death had various purposes in mind. A major consideration was that at that point they strongly believed that Jesus would return any day and that, since time was short, those who were enslaved or of low social status and power would be suffering only a little while longer. In other words, Jesus upon his return would re-order society imminently, so it wasn't important to do so themselves.
