After his suffering Jesus presented himself alive to them by many convincing proofs, appearing to them during forty days and speaking about the kin-dom of God. While staying with them, he ordered them not

to leave Jerusalem, but to wait there for the promise of the Creator. "This," he said, "is what you have heard from me; for John baptized with water, but you will be baptized with the Holy Spirit not many days from now." So when they had come together, they asked him, "Lord, is this the time when you will restore the kin-dom to Israel?" He replied, "It is not for you to know the times or periods that the Creator has set. But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit has come upon you; and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, in all Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth." When he had said this, as they were watching, he was lifted up, and a cloud took him out of their sight. While he was going and they were gazing up toward heaven, suddenly two people in white robes stood by them. They said, "People of Galilee, why do you stand looking up toward heaven? This Jesus, who has been taken up from you into heaven, will come in the same way as you saw him go into heaven.

Then Jesus said to them, "These are my words that I spoke to you while I was still with you - that everything written about me in the law of Moses, the prophets, and the psalms must be fulfilled." Then he opened their minds to understand the scriptures, and he said to them, "Thus it is written, that the Messiah is to suffer and to rise from the dead on the third day, and that repentance and forgiveness of sins is to be proclaimed in his name to all nations, beginning from Jerusalem. You are witnesses of these things. And see, I am sending upon you what the Creator promised; so stay here in the city until you have been clothed with power on high." Then Jesus led them out as far as Bethany, and, lifting up his hands, he blessed them and was carried up into heaven. And they worshipped him, and returned to Jerusalem with great joy; and they were continually in the temple blessing God.

May we hear what the Spirit is saying to the church. **Thanks be to God.**

#### **CONGREGATIONAL MEETING**

On June 4th at noon in Memorial Hall, an in person congregational meeting will be held to discuss and vote on the Community of Faith Profile. This document shares the story of Robertson-Wesley United, who we are and what we believe God is calling this faith community to do and be in the next 10 - 15 years. Through surveys, interviews and discussions, the Community of Faith Task Group, and with the leadership of Rev. Lynn Maki (in visioning), the Board finalized the report with the proposed new minister job descriptions. The Northern Spirit Region Pastoral Relations Commission of the United Church has approved the updated profile, and the next step is to share it with R-W community of faith. When the congregation has approved this report, Robertson-Wesley can then begin the search for the permanent minister(s). The report can be found on the website **rwuc.org/cofp**.
