CONGREGATIONAL MEETING

On **June 4**th at noon in Memorial Hall, an in person congregational meeting will be held to discuss and vote on the Community of Faith Profile. This document shares the story of Robertson-Wesley United, who we are and what we believe God is calling this faith community to do and be in the next 10 - 15 years. Through surveys, interviews and discussions, the Community of Faith Task Group, and with the leadership of Rev. Lynn Maki (in visioning), the Board finalized the report with the proposed new minister job descriptions. The Northern Spirit Region Pastoral Relations Commission of the United Church has approved the updated profile, and the next step is to share it with the R-W community of faith. When the congregation has approved this report, R-W can then begin the search for the permanent minister(s). The report can be found on the website **rwuc.org/cofp**. If you would like a printed copy of the report please contact the church office. Robertson-Wesley's Bridging Minister, Rev. Dirk Jessen will chair the June 4th meeting.

World Environment Day is **June 5**. Here are a few suggestions for special things to do that day:

- Walk outdoors and observe aspects of nature that you never noticed before (eg. the different ways that birds walk on the ground in search of bugs to eat, the shape of the clouds in the sky).
- Thank the North Saskatchewan River for its gifts to Edmonton.
- Send a letter to a politician emphasizing the importance of caring for Mother Earth.
- Begin to read a book about nature (eg. *Finding the Mother Tree* by Suzanne Simard, *Wildscape* by Nancy Lawson).
- Ask an older adult to recall memories of nature from childhood.
- Take a walk with a young child and look at clouds, flowers, etc.
- Promise yourself to find ways to reduce your use of fossil fuels.
- Donate money to an environmental organization.

In the Community

GUARANTEED LIVABLE INCOME

Since 1972 -fifty-one years ago!- the United Church has been advocating for a Guaranteed Livable Income. On April 18, the Senate voted to send Bill S-233 – the National Framework for a Guaranteed Livable Basic Income Act – to be reviewed by the Senate Standing Committee on National Finance where they will discuss the merits of the Bill as written, propose changes, and hear from expert witnesses. This is a significant step forward. For a Bill to become law it needs to pass in both the House and Senate. Luckily, Bill C-223, S-233's sister bill with the exact same text, has already been introduced in the House and is awaiting an opportunity to be debated--probably in the Fall. The next step is encouraging our elected representatives to follow the example of the Senate. Contact your MP directly or use the advocacy tool on UBIWorks website (ubiworks.ca/guaranteed-livable-basic-income) to encourage the movement of these bills.


