GREEN BITES

Some years ago I was driving downtown during a very heavy rainstorm. I was horrified to see the vast volume of water pouring onto the streets in the direction of the drains. How can the City of Edmonton deal with this huge amount of runoff, I wondered. The next day I called 311, the number I occasionally call if I want information regarding waste management, transportation, etc. I was connected to someone who was an expert regarding rain water. When I enquired about the city's plans for additional drainage due to in-fill and the increasing number of high-rises. I received dead silence. However, the city must have considered water management in the intervening years because on the city's website is a very interesting document entitled How to Build a Rain Garden. I had heard of Herb Gardens, Rock Gardens, Butterfly Gardens, but a Rain Garden was new to me. A rain garden can be built on a slope, and filled with a variety of plants that are known for their absorption of water. The idea behind a rain garden is to remove pollutants from rain runoff before it gets into the city's water treatment system. As well, rain gardens slow down the flow of water, reduce flooding, and provide habitat for birds and beneficial insects. Their purpose is to become the wetlands that we humans destroyed to make the land more suitable for housing or agriculture. Check out the city of Edmonton's website and search for Rain Garden in a Box. The article which is almost sixty pages in length is filled with information about how to build a rain garden, the plants to select, and the care the garden needs. Building a rain garden would be an excellent summer project for a family, including grandparents and grandchildren. And what memories would be created! -The Environmental Stewardship Group
