GREEN BITES

With Autumn around the corner, this is the time when we think about moving our summer clothes to the back of the closet, turning off the air conditioner, and adding an extra blanket to our beds. For years many of us followed "expert" advice and prepared our gardens for winter by cutting back plants and shrubs and sending our leaves to the city's composting facility. Little did we know that by doing so, we were destroying the eggs of many insects, thereby reducing the amount of food available for birds and other creatures. No wonder the bird population is in decline.* In recent years, birds have had to contend with warmer temperatures. They don't sweat like mammals do. Scientists have determined that July 2023 was the hottest month in the past 120,000 vears. But wild creatures can't retreat to air-conditioned houses, or find water to drink in a parched landscape. As autumn gives way to winter. we can encourage birds to inhabit our neighbourhoods by providing birdfeeders filled with nourishing seeds, birdbaths with heaters to keep water from freezing, and unpruned trees and plants that provide shelter.

*The decline in the bird population is due to many factors, including destruction of habitat as well as the increased use of glass, without suitable constraints to reduce bird collisions, in building construction.
