

# God's Holy Word

Scripture: Jericho Ferguson

Genesis 2:4b-25 • The Garden of Eden

In the day that the Lord God made the earth and the heavens, when no plant of the field was yet in the earth and no herb of the field had yet sprung up for the Lord God has not caused it to rain upon the earth, and there was no one to till the ground; but a stream would rise from the earth, and water the whole face of the ground - then the Lord God formed human from the dust of the ground, and breathed into their nostrils the breath of life; and the human became a living being. And the Lord God planted a garden in Eden, in the east; and there God put the human whom God had formed. Out of the ground the Lord God made to grow every tree that is pleasant to the sight and good for food, the tree of life also in the midst of the garden, and the tree of the knowledge of good and evil. A river flows out of Eden to water the garden, and from there it divides and becomes four branches. The name of the first is Pishon; it is the one that flows around the whole land of Havilah, where there is gold; and the gold of that land is good; bdellium and onyx stone are there. The name of the second river is Gihon; it is the one that flows around the whole land of Cush. The name of the third river is Tigris, which flows east of Assyria. And the fourth river is the Euphrates. The Lord God took the human and put them in the garden of Eden to till it and keep it. And the Lord God commanded the human, "You may freely eat of every tree of the garden; but of the tree of the knowledge of good and evil you shall not eat, for on the day that you eat of it you shall die." Then the Lord God said, "It is not good that the human should be alone: I will make a helper as a partner." So out of the ground the Lord God formed every animal of the field and every bird of the air, and brought them to the human to see what the human would call them; and whatever the human called every living creature, that was its name. The human gave names to all cattle, and to the birds of the air, and to every animal of the field; but for the human there was not found a helper as a partner. So the Lord God caused a deep sleep to fall upon the human, and they slept; then God took one of the ribs and closed up its place with flesh. And the rib that the Lord God had taken from the human he made into another human and brought them to each other. Then the human said, "This at last is bone of my bones and flesh of my flesh". And the humans were both naked, and were not ashamed.

May we hear what the Spirit is saying to the church.

**Sermon:** God in Those Around Us

The main story we hear today is of God and a couple of other heavenly beings visiting Abraham and Sarah incognito in the form of human travellers. As

continues to be the case in many cultures, care of and hospitality toward travelling strangers was for Sarah and Abraham a deeply held cultural value. Apparently as a matter of course, Abraham and Sarah treat the trio not with grudging acceptance, but with genuine thoughtful generosity. As can happen in good visits, there is deep conversation and humour shared between guests and hosts. As is also possible, this visit is remembered later because of its importance. In this case, the visit also plays a role in the naming of Sarah and Abraham's first-born. Do you have an experience of giving or receiving hospitality that you remember as being close to a holy encounter?

#### **GREEN BITES**

Many older people in Canada have childhood memories of seeing the Northern Lights, the Aurora Borealis, in the night sky. However, nowadays the Northern Lights are seldom seen in cities because of "light pollution". Scientists and others who are especially concerned with the huge increase in artificial lights outdoors have succeeded in establishing Dark Sky Reserves throughout the world. They are places where artificial light is considerably reduced, and the public is welcome to visit and observe the night sky. Edmonton's closest Dark Sky Preserves are Elk Island National Park and Miquelon Park.
