# NO ROOM IN THE INN

For nearly 25 years, *No Room In the Inn* has led a successful crossdenominational holiday campaign to raise money for housing those in need. For 2023, *A Safe Place* has been selected as the recipient organization. Since 1982, *A Safe Place* has been empowering women by providing comprehensive services, including: advocacy, education, court support, counselling, supported referrals, Community Outreach, New Beginnings, and more. The roof of A Safe Place's current facility, which is used to both serve clients escaping intimate violence and run the organization, is in need of immediate repairs – the cost of which is significant.
