Advent 3

Children & Youth: Children begin in the sanctuary, then go to Kids' Church. Youth meet in the youth room at the beginning of the service.

Ezra 1:1-4; 3:1-4, 10-13 • Return from exile and rebuild the temple.

Sermon: Shared Worship, Shared Celebration, Shared Grief

Unexpectedly, miraculously, Persian King Darius takes pity on the Israelites who are captive in Babylon, a newly acquired part of his empire. Central to his setting them free is his direction, God's direction, that they return to Jerusalem to resume worship in the Temple. Within the year, the Israelites are indeed gathered in Jerusalem to celebrate a holy day. Although the Babylonians had burned the Temple to the ground, a new altar was built on the remnants of the old one so that worship could be resumed, particularly the sacrifices prescribed in the sacred law. Part of this worship was the sound of priestly singing accompanied by trumpets and cymbals as in the time of King David. The sound of this liturgical music and the scent of sacrifices being made move the people to both shouts joy and weeping. When has liturgy moved you to a feeling of great joy? When has it moved you to a feeling of deep sorrow? How was each important and meaningful? **Music:** Dr. Allan Bevan, organist; Robertson-Wesley Choir

NO ROOM IN THE INN

For nearly 25 years, No Room In the Inn has led a successful crossdenominational holiday campaign to raise money for housing those in need. For 2023, A Safe Place has been selected as the recipient organization. Since 1982, A Safe Place has been empowering women by providing comprehensive services, including: advocacy, education, court support, counselling, supported referrals, Community Outreach, New Beginnings, and more. The roof of A Safe Place's current facility, which is used to both serve clients escaping intimate violence and run the organization, is in need of immediate repairs – the cost of which is significant. The season of Advent marks the beginning of the Christian Liturgical Year. This is a time of preparation, waiting, expectation and longing as we await the coming of Christ in the form of a baby. In this season the colour blue symbolizes new life and new beginnings. You will notice that the paraments (the cloth on the pulpit and the communion table are blue). You will also notice that there are three blue candles, a pink candle and a white candle in the Advent Wreath. Each Sunday we light a candle to help us mark the next step on the journey to Bethlehem. Each candle represents a different theme: hope, peace, joy and love. The white candle is lit at Christmas in honour of Jesus, (the pink candle is joy).
