Mark 12: 1-17 • Parable of the wicked tenants; paying taxes to Caesar Then Jesus began to speak to them in parables. "A person planted a vineyard, put a fence around it, dug a pit for the wine press, and built a watchtower: then he leased it to tenants and went to another country. When the season came, he sent a slave to the tenants to collect from them his share of the produce of the vineyard. But they seized him, and beat him, and sent him away empty-handed. And again he sent another slave to them; this one they beat over the head and insulted. Then he sent another, and that one they killed. And so it was with many others; some they beat and others they killed. The owner had still one other, a beloved son. Finally, he sent his son to them, saying, "They will respect my son.' But those tenants said to one another, "This is the heir; come, let us kill him, and the inheritance will be ours. So they seized him, killed him, and threw him out of the vineyard. What then will the owner of the vineyard do? He will come and destroy the tenants and give the vineyard to others. Have you not read this scripture: 'The stone that the builders rejected has become the cornerstone; this was the Lord's doing, and it is amazing in our eyes'?" When they realized that Jesus had told this parable against them, they wanted to arrest him, but they feared the

crowd. So they left Jesus and went away. Then they sent to him some Pharisees and some Herodians to trap him in what he said. And they came and said to Jesus, "Teacher, we know that you are sincere, and show deference to no one; for you do not regard people with partiality, but teach the way of God in accordance with truth. Is it lawful to pay taxes to the emperor, or not? Should we pay them, or should we not?" But knowing their hypocrisy, Jesus said to them, "Why are you putting me to the test? Bring me a denarius and let me see it." And they brought one. Then he said to them, "Whose head is this, and whose title?" They answered, "The emperor's." Jesus said to them, "Give to the emperor the things that are the emperor's, and to God the things that are Gods." And they were utterly amazed at him.

May we hear what the Spirit is saving to the church.

When we sing to God in heaven, we shall find such harmony, born of all we've known together of Christ's love and agony.



Sermon: Jesus' Elevator Pitch

Jesus and his disciples have arrived in Jerusalem. Religious authorities have taken notice and attempt to trick Jesus into saying something controversial (and hopefully blasphemous) so they can have him detained

and silenced. Jesus answers yet another potentially entrapping question in such a succinct way that his opponents dare not challenge him any more. He goes on to acknowledge the faithfulness of someone most unexpected in contrast to members of the religious elite. How does Jesus answer the question about the most important commandment? GREEN BITES: WHAT IS FOOD SOVEREIGNTY?

"Food Sovereignty is the right of peoples to healthy and culturally appropriate food produced through ecologically sound and sustainable methods, and their right to define their own food and agricultural systems."-Via Campesina

There are seven pillars to food sovereignty. They are:

- 1. Focuses on food for people 2. Builds knowledge and skills
- 3. Works with nature
- 5. Localizes food systems6. Puts control locally
- 7. Food is sacred
- 4. Values food providers

Although most of us have heard of Food Security, Food Sovereignty is the way in which we get there. Imagine a world in which farmers themselves, rather than corporations, are in charge of growing our food. Ideally they work with nature, treat their workers well, grow local crops for local consumers, and most of all, consider that they are doing sacred work.
