began to say to them, "Beware that no one leads you astray. Many will come in my name and say, "I am he!" and they will lead many astray. When you hear of wars and rumours of wars, do not be alarmed; this must take place, but the end is still to come. For nation will rise against nation, and kingdom against kingdom; there will be earthquakes in various places; there will be famines. This is but the beginning of the birth pangs. It is written, 'But in those days, after that suffering, the sun will be darkened, and the moon will not give its light, and the stars will be falling from heaven, and the powers in the heavens will be shaken.' Then they will see 'the One from God coming in clouds' with great power and glory. Then God will send out the angels, and gather God's elect from the four winds, from the ends of the earth to the ends of heaven. From the fig tree learn its lesson: as soon as its branch becomes tender and puts forth its leaves, you know that summer is near. So also, when you see these things taking place, you know that he is near, at the very gates. Truly I tell you, this generation will not pass away until all these things have taken place. Scripture: Mark 11:1-11 • Triumphal entry **Sermon:** The Value of Gracious Leadership

While the Roman Army entered the city of Jerusalem, Jesus approached the city by another way. Jesus approached the city as a leader filled with grace. Jesus's ministry was one of mutual sharing of power. Jesus' leadership was not about self-interest but rather the community's well-being. This passage demonstrates the difference between leaders who judge, control and seek to withhold information, with leaders who seek and share information, who are not about holding power over others but rather empowering others to share their gifts and experiences to do what is beneficial to the community. They do not ask who has the power, but instead ask the question, 'Whom should we empower to do what is right?' How will Jesus show us a new way of relating to one another? How will we seek to empower others rather than grabbing power for ourselves?
