Acts 1:1-14 • You shall be my witnesses in Jerusalem.

In the first book, Theophilus, I wrote about all that Jesus did and taught from the beginning until the day when he was taken up to heaven, after giving instructions through the Holy Spirit to the apostles whom he had chosen. After his suffering he presented himself alive to them by many convincing proofs, appearing to them during forty days and speaking about the kin-dom of God. While staying with them, he ordered them not to leave Jerusalem,

but to wait there for the promise of the Creator. "This," Jesus said, "Is what you have heard from me; for John baptized with water, but you will be baptized with the Holy Spirit not many days from now." So when they had come together, they asked him, "Lord, is this the time when you will restore the kin-dom to Israel?" He replied, "It is not for you to know the times or periods that the Creator has set by the Lord's own authority. But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit has come upon you; and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, in all Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth." When Jesus had said this, as they were watching, he was lifted up, and a cloud took him out of their sight. While he was going and they were gazing up toward heaven, suddenly two people in white robes stood by them. They said, "People of Galilee, why do you stand looking up toward heaven? This Jesus, who has been taken up from you into heaven, will come in the same way as you saw him go into heaven." Then they returned to Jerusalem from the mount called Olivet, which is near Jerusalem, a sabbath day's journey away. When they had entered the city, they went to the room upstairs where they were staying, Peter, and John, and James, and Andrew, Philip and Thomas, Bartholomew and Matthew, James, son of Alphaeus, and Simon the Zealot, and Judas, son of James. All these were constantly devoting themselves to prayer, together with certain women, including Mary the mother of Jesus, as well as his brothers.

May we hear what the Spirit is saying to the church.

GREEN BITES

Many Edmonton area gardeners are wondering how to tend our gardens in the face of climate change. Here are some suggestions:

- 1. Practise no-till when preparing the soil this Spring.
- 2. Reduce the size of lawn and replace with leafy plants that reduce CO2 levels
- 3. Use less artificial fertilizer on plants and gardens.
- 4. The more varieties of plants in a garden, the less chance of damage from extreme weather.
- 5. The more diverse the plant selection, the more support there is for beneficial insects and pollinators.
- 6. Include native plants that have been selected for their qualities and not just because they are native.

RWUC REFUGEE PROJECT TEAM UPDATE

In June 2022, the RWUC Refugee Project Team submitted sponsorship application forms for Jael Tshoba and Bolot Mayaka to The United Church of Canada. The UCC, which is allocated a set number of refugee spots annually through its refugee sponsorship agreement with the Government of Canada, put the RWUC application on their 2023-24 submission list. The application was submitted to Immigration, Refugees and Citizenship Canada (IRCC) on December 8, 2023. The Resettlement Operations Centre in Ottawa (ROCO), the government agency responsible for processing privately sponsored refugee applications, approved the sponsorship application on March 13, 2024. ROCO then forwarded the refugee application for permanent residence to the IRCC office in Pretoria, South Africa where Jael and Bolot currently live. The processing time can be lengthy and, until the application has been uploaded by the Pretoria visa office, we can't monitor the application's progress online. We'll keep you posted on any updates. In the meantime, we ask for your continued prayers for Jael and Bolot, until they arrive in Canada and are reunited with their brother/brother-in-law Charles Sabu, a long-time member of our congregation. -Nova, Refugee Project Team
