### ACCESSIBILITY

There are accessible washrooms on each floor located near the elevator.

We commit to make R-W a comfortable space for people with cognitive impairment. If you require accommodations please contact the office.

There is a sensory-friendly worship space in the Club Room every Sunday, the service is live streamed into the room with reduced lighting and volume.

### **BABY/ CHILDREN'S AMENITIES**

People can breastfeed anywhere in the building, should you want more privacy there is designated nursing space in the Millson room, located by the grand piano. Baby changing tables are installed in all washrooms. If you wish to use it, a children's activity centre is set up in the Chapel. There are also activity books available for children. Please ask an usher.



This is based on the hours of facility usage used by the Gratitude Team and includes the cost of Facility staff time.


### Admin \$2,536.25

This is the administrative costs of the Gratitude Team, including printing, photocopying, materials, postage, etc., and the cost of the Office Administrator time.

All of the staff costs are part of the current staff wages, and these numbers represent the part of those wages allocated to work done with the Gratitude Team during the year.

### Deficit \$1,659.30

This is the Gratitude Teams share of the total projected deficit of the church for this year.



# God's Holy Word

### Prayer of Illumination:

God, the words you speak have power: power to create, power to disturb, power to heal. Help us to hear your Word for us today. **Amen.**<sup>2</sup>

Scripture: Kecia Nzeyimana

1 Corinthians 1:4-18 • Divisions in the Church.

I give thanks to my God always for you because of the grace of God that has been given you in Christ Jesus, for in every way you have been enriched in him, in speech and knowledge of every kind - just as the testimony of Christ has been strengthened among you - so that you are not lacking in any spiritual gift as you wait for the revealing of our Lord Jesus Christ. God will also strengthen you to the end, so that you may be blameless on the day of our Lord Jesus Christ. God is faithful; by God you were called into the fellowship of Jesus Christ our Lord. Now I appeal to you siblings, by the name of our Lord Jesus Christ that all of you be in agreement and that there be no divisions among you, but that you be united in the same mind and the same purpose. For it has been reported to me by Chloe's people that there are quarrels among you, my siblings. What I mean is that each of you says, "I belong to Paul," or "I belong to Apollos," or "I belong to Cephas," or "I belong to Christ." Has Christ been divided? Was Paul crucified for you? Or were you baptized in the name of Paul? I thank God that I baptized none of you except Crispus and Gaius, so that no one can say that you were baptized in my name. (I did baptize also the household of Stephanas; beyond that, I do not know whether I baptized anyone else.) For Christ did not send me to baptize but to proclaim the gospel, and not with eloquent wisdom, so that the cross of Christ might not be emptied of its power. For the message about the cross is foolishness to those who are perishing, but to us who are being saved it is the power of God.

May we hear what the Spirit is saying to the church.

**Scripture:** 1 Corinthians 13:1-13 • The Gift of Love

**Sermon**: What's Love Got to Do With It?

Paul's letter to the community of faith in Corinth addresses a number of difficult questions about how they are to live and worship together. How

should they understand and value spiritual gifts like healing and ecstatic speech, both among themselves and in relationships beyond their immediate community? How should they share the Lord's Supper (communion) within their community? What are the standards of sexual morality they should expect of each other? These are complex topics and no easy answers given. Yet, in the midst of it all, Paul pauses the advice and instruction to offer a reflection on the characteristics and effects of love, more specifically God's love. At first it seems like an interruption in the flow of the letter. Taking a closer look, it just may be the perfect way to transform the most difficult of discussions. Have you ever been in a difficult discussion or situation that could have used a reset or reframing? If such a reset happened, how did it take place? What difference did it make?
