

Large print worship bulletins, and hymn books are available from the ushers.

Service animals are welcome, except where food is prepared.

We commit to make R-W a comfortable space for people with cognitive impairment. If you require accommodations please contact the office.

There is a sensory-friendly worship space in the Club Room every Sunday, the service is live streamed into the room with reduced lighting and volume.

#### **BABY/ CHILDREN'S AMENITIES**

People can breastfeed anywhere in the building, should you want more privacy there is designated nursing space in the Millson room, located by the grand piano. Baby changing tables are installed in all washrooms. If you wish to use it, a children's activity centre is set up in the Chapel. There are also activity books available for children. Please ask an usher.

But as for prophecies, they will come to an end; as for tongues, it will come to an end. For we know only in part, and we prophesy only in part; but when the complete comes, the partial will come to an end. When I was a child, I spoke like a child, I thought like a child, I reasoned like a child; when I became an adult, I put an end to childish ways. For now we see in a mirror dimly, but then we will see face to face. Now I know only in part; then I will know fully, even as I have been fully known. And now faith, hope, and love abide, these three; and the greatest of these is love.

Sermon: Vulnerable and open!

What does it mean to be in right relationship with God? What does it mean to be in right relationship with others? How do we truly come to know one another and learn about how God is at work in our lives? We need to enter the intimate practices of testimony and prayer. # Worship Notes

"Heart" For most of us the meaning of heart is most closely related to emotions, feelings. Because of this the first commandment, "to love God with all your heart" can sound like having a positive feeling toward God, something that while nice is also a bit fleeting. In both the Old Testament and New Testaments "heart" means a lot more than feelings. The ancients had no sense of a brain or mind separate from the body. Instead a person's "heart" was understood first and foremost, to relate to a person's inner life: thoughts, personality, will. Because of this, opening one's heart toward God meant a lot more than simply a warm feeling. It meant a total openness and total commitment to God.
