We commit to make R-W a comfortable space for people with cognitive impairment. If you require accommodations please contact the office.

There is a sensory-friendly worship space in the Club Room every Sunday, the service is live streamed into the room with reduced lighting and volume.

BABY/ CHILDREN'S AMENITIES

People can breastfeed anywhere in the building, should you want more privacy there is designated nursing space in the Millson room, located by the grand piano. Baby changing tables are installed in all washrooms. If you wish to use it, a children's activity centre is set up in the Chapel. There are also activity books available for children. Please ask an usher.

GREEN BITES

- 1. Here are a few ideas to reduce our use of plastics:
- 2. Buy un-tubed toothpaste which is sold as pill-size tablets.
- 3. When needing an extra bag at the grocery store, purchase one that is made of paper rather than plastic.
- 4. When purchasing an item packed in plastic, remove the purchased item and leave behind the plastic material that has been used as packing. Manufacturers and retailers will soon get the message!
- 5. When purchasing bulk food items, take them home in packaging that you have carried with you to the store.
- 6. Examine labels thoroughly before purchasing items made of manufactured materials.
- 7. Ingredients such as polypropylene and polyethylene usually indicate the presence of microbeads so avoid purchasing them.
